### 1.0 Purpose / Scope

BorgWarner is a community of people committed to protecting the environment for the benefit of society, future generations and each of us as individuals. BorgWarner recognizes that access to clean air, water and sanitation, and safe and healthy communities is a basic human right. From the innovative products we make to reduce emissions and improve fuel economy to where and how we make them, we strive to conserve, recycle and reuse our resources efficiently, through the use of responsible and sustainable environmental practices.

### 2.0 Application

This policy applies to all of BorgWarner's worldwide operations. Individual locations may create additional environmental policies specific to their operations.

### 3.0 Objectives

To deliver on our commitment to the environment and minimize our impacts concerning our manufacturing activities, products and services, BorgWarner will:

- Identify potential environmental impacts posed by each BorgWarner location, taking into account the specific nature of the business conducted there;
- Identify and implement practicable measures to reduce waste, prevent pollution and conserve natural resources;
- Conduct operations in compliance with applicable federal, state and local environmental laws and regulations;
- Ensure the environmental integrity of our products and processes through the evaluation and minimization of environmental impacts related to resource consumption, chemical management and waste production, and external environmental threats;
- Commit to review and continuously improve our environmental performance, our objectives and targets and continue to integrate sound environmental practices into our business;
- Engage and communicate with our supply chain in order to minimize our indirect environmental impacts and;
- Measure and monitor key environmental performance indicators (such as energy and water consumption and GHG emissions) and regularly report results to management, the Corporate Governance Committee of the Board of Directors and our external stakeholders.
